



HILLSDALE COLLEGE is a private liberal arts college with approximately 1,400 students. Founded in 1844, the College remains, in the words of its Articles of Association, "grateful to God for the inestimable blessings resulting from the prevalence of civil and religious liberty and intelligent piety" in our nation, and dedicated to "the diffusion of sound learning" that is "essential to the perpetuity of these blessings." It is distinguished by its rigorous core curriculum, by its principled rejection of federal and state taxpayer funding, and by the pledge of its Board of Trustees to resist any attempts by the government to regulate its internal affairs.

Hillsdale promotes the principles of liberty nationwide through its national speech digest, *Imprimis*, which has a monthly circulation of over 2.9 million, and through several outreach programs, including the Center for Constructive Alternatives, one of the largest college lecture series in America; the Hoogland Center for Teacher Excellence, which holds seminars for high school teachers of civics and history; the National Leadership Seminars; its Online Learning Program offering free courses in topics such as the U.S. Constitution, the Great Books, and economics; and the Sherlock Hibbs Hillsdale Hostels.

In 2008, Hillsdale launched its Allan P. Kirby, Jr. Center for Constitutional Studies and Citizenship in Washington, D.C., and in 2012, it launched the Van Andel Graduate School of Statesmanship on campus.
